Polling was conducted online from June 27 - 29, 2023. Using its Bias Correct Engine to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 1298 likely 2024 voters in Florida. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, region and 2020 vote.
